Communitas

This year, the Merici community has been called, as people of God, to activate our hearts, heads and hands to connect to those around us. We were invited to walk in Jesus' footsteps and be inspired by his model of love, acceptance, mercy and understanding. Our theme of connection is in so many of Jesus' parables – the Good Samaritan being one. It is in many of the gospel accounts of Jesus and his followers gathering together to share each others' company. It is in the Martha and Mary story which illustrates just how important Jesus thought it was for all of us to take time in our busy lives to stop and connect with each other, to share stories, ideas and to commune spiritually with our God. Jesus asked his followers to welcome those on the margins and, by gathering, to form "church". He says

"For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." (Matt 18:20).

In 2023 we have sought to live according to the philosophy of "UBUNTU" that emphasises the importance of community. Great leaders such as Nelson Mandela and Archbishop Desmond Tutu often referred to it when pointing out that healing is achieved in community not in isolation. Nelson Mandela says that Ubuntu encompasses the interdependence of humans on another and the acknowledgment of one's responsibility to their fellow humans and the world around them. We all are indeed blessed that in 2023, we have had the impetus to act and positively shape our lives and that of others. Our College seeks to be a "bright candle" that makes a positive difference in our local and global communities.

We are a joy-filled and dynamic learning community, intent on building upon the heritage founded by all that have come before us. I am proud to a member of a learning community that responds to changing circumstances with courage, agility, positivity, resilience and skill.

CATHOLIC CULTURE AND IDENTITY

We have achieved so much as a community this year. We have aspired to live our Catholic values through many initiatives:

- expanding the CYSMA program and Angela's Angels.
- Supporting the dynamic student led Leadership Team and their 'new traditions' in 2023, including our very own Merici College Olympics and pop-up Social Justice/Mission guest speakers.

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- Reviewed the Student Leadership program and thus created two new leadership roles for 2024: the Arts and Culture Captaincies with a view to re-invigorating the SRC (or Student Voice) in 2024.
- Celebrating record numbers of students achieving Christian Service Learning Program Angel Wings and creating, for the first time, Platinum (300 hour) and Diamond (500 hour) Angel Wing awards.
- Recognising long serving staff, most notably Mr Gerard Ryan and Ms Virginia McLeod in the naming of significant areas in the College.

The student body also chose to name our café, Angie's Cafe, in honour of our College's special St Angela Merici and plans are afoot to create an even more inviting space in which to gather and relax.

EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

Our staff have worked collaboratively to build capacity and leadership in order to ensure that we are continually improving and seeking excellence in all that we do. Leadership retreats and training courses for Merici College Senior and Middle Leaders have been initiated and will be annual or bi-annual events. Twice yearly Professional Conversations for all staff are now conducted as part of the Merici College Performance and Development cycle. The third wave of staff to be trained in Catalyst have been working incredibly hard to focus on best practice pedagogy and Merici has led the way in developing Catalyst Instructional Coaching in order to embed and scale the wonderful learnings this System approach has offered to teaching staff.

All of this effort is being reflected in excellence in teaching and learning data at Merici College where high expectations for student growth, efforts and achievement are the norm. It is also reflected in the dedicated work so many staff have put into enabling exchanges and global outreach at Merici. A number of international experiences have been meticulously planned during 2023 in order for our young women to connect with the world in 2024.

PARTNERSHIP AND COMMUNITY

Our extended community has also worked to enrich our lives at Merici College. The College Board, as always, has been a rich source of expert advice concerning several key areas during 2023. These include Catholic Education Canberra & Goulburn (CECG) reviews of governance structures, system changes in terms of financial structures and strategically planning for an expanding number of student enrolments. The Parent and Friends sub-committee of the College Board have been active in building a sense of belonging for our families by supporting our Healthy Food policy and Canteen, family functions such as the Community BBQ at the start of the year, Trivia Night and Christmas Picnic. Our extended Merici family have continued to be active in support of all our young women endeavour to do, be it in sport, clubs and major productions such as Alice in Wonderland. I am especially proud to recognise the achievement of so many, working in partnership to create and launch a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) for Merici College. Students, staff, parents, carers and indigenous community members worked in unison form this plan and will continue to strive, with all, to achieve the challenging goals identified in the RAP.

STEWARDSHIP AND RESOURCES

We live in community in a fragile and beautiful environment. 2023 has seen many work to care for our common creation. The Sustainability at Merici (SAM) group and Sustainability classes have partnered with university academics to start a long-term re-wilding project at Merici College and the College has initiated the re-registration process as an ACT Smart school. Primary school students have been shown how to plant and grow vegetables and our team is becoming more involved in Archdiocese initiatives around Laudato Si.

Merici College is a member of a number of dynamic systems. We like to think big and be leaders within that those systems and even more broadly. In 2023, the College has been privileged to support, host and participate in a number of programs and events. We have hosted more than 500 young people with the Shine Conference, the Sharing Best Practice Conference and Catalyst workshops for staff from across the CECG system. We have welcomed visitors from across Australia who want to observe what we are doing in the Catalyst space and in our classrooms. Merici College has proudly supported system innovations in Virtual Learning and two of our teachers were recognised at the CECG Awards evening held in August for their contributions in this space. Our expert staff have been members of Board of Senior School Studies working groups and have been recognised as exemplary in BSSS Moderation Day reports.

The College worked to develop our Master Plan, in consultation and collaboration with CECG, focusing on stewardship for the future and providing certainty around enrolment capacity. This will be launched early in 2024.
