Research Study on Metacognition, 'Learning how to learn'

Student's views are very important for understanding the nature of life-changing, impactful teaching and learning.

Metacognition refers to the ability to be aware of and control performance. It covers a range of thinking skills and self-regulatory behaviour. Metacognition is fundamental for students to experience meaningful learning and to help them to develop the ability to transfer their educational experiences to new contexts.

Annie Termaat is a PhD candidate at Deakin University with an interest in what teachers are doing to help students develop these thinking skills and independence in learning. The research study, *Meaning in the middle years: how metacognition in curricula is translated in pedagogy and student perceptions*, has been approved by Deakin University (reference: 2023-069), the Catholic Education archdiocese of Canberra Goulburn (Record No: R656208) and Mrs Masters, our Principal. In 2024, Annie will be continuing the research she started at Merici College last year, by visiting classes with students in Years 7 and 9.

Annie will be investigating links between curriculums (for example, the Thinking and Critical thinking General Capability in the Australian Curriculum), teachers' classroom practice and the views of the adolescent learners, across several subjects in ACT schools. As with all higher degree research, the outcomes will be shared with the participants, who will be anonymous in the reports. Classroom based education research that includes the perspectives of young people is relatively uncommon, and therefore Annie is extremely grateful to the families willing to support this important work.

Annie will be audio-recording lessons of Grade 7 or Grade 9 students, nominated by participating teachers of English, Mathematics, Science or Humanities/Social Sciences. The purpose of the research is to discover patterns used by teachers of different subjects, and how these change as students become older. Teachers who agree to participate in the project will also complete an on-line survey and a brief interview about the practices that they emphasise in their teaching, and they will ask their students to complete a short reflection activity towards the end of the observations, which will provide them with feedback about their students' learning.

Students in observed lessons will be asked to reflect on how they learn by completing a cartoon called a Pupil Views Template (PVT). This single sheet of paper shows children in a teaching situation, with speech and thought bubbles, to which students add thoughts about their learning, and perhaps details such as the facial expressions or background information, if they wish. PVT information from many students, from multiple schools, can be collated and analysed for patterns, for example, to discover how students generally feel about learning a certain subject. Only the PVTs of students whose parents support their child's views being represented in the research can be collected for this analysis. No child will be personally identifiable in the study results.

NAPLAN 2024

The testing period for NAPLAN is upon us and we would like to notify you of the testing schedule occurring over Week 7 and 8 (13th March-19th March) for Years 7 and 9. Students will go to the same room for ALL of their NAPLAN tests based on their House:

Important information:

- Students need to bring their devices fully charged and must bring headphones to all of the tests (ideally plug in headphones rather than wireless due to Bluetooth interference). We also suggest bringing a book to read if students finish with time to spare.
- Please note that if the NAP2024 Locked Down Browser is still not downloaded on the students' device, it is important that this is completed at home by being downloaded from this <u>link</u>.
- Students with Personalised Plans who require adjustments such as additional time or readers/scribes will receive a separate email to them and their parents outlining what provisions have been applied.
- If you know your daughter will be absent for one of the days scheduled for testing, please send an email to the Literacy Coordinator nicole.commins@merici.act.edu.au so we can put her in for the Catch Up Test Session on Tuesday 19th March in Periods 5 and 6. Likewise, if you wish to withdraw your child from NAPLAN, please ensure you contact us ASAP.

As reiterated in previous communications, these tests are used as a growth measurement at Merici. It is a busy time with assessment tasks, and hence we would prefer students spend their time on assessment tasks, not preparing for NAPLAN.

As such, outside of the Demonstrations Tests, as conducted in class using the NAP Locked Down Browser, we do not require students to study for these tests. The skills that they are learning in their lessons should equip them with the skills to complete these NAPLAN tests.

Merici College has a number of databases and resources that are available from home 24/7. These are all located on our <u>SEQTA/site home</u>. One such database, Sora by Overdrive is a digital library of eBooks and audiobooks for students of all year levels, as well as adults. The collection includes fiction, as well as non-fiction titles related to the Australian curriculum topics. The current collection includes over 10,000 eBooks and audiobooks, including 'Read-a-long' books.

The collection is available 24/7 from any device. It can be accessed through <u>Merici SEQTA</u> or by downloading the Sora app onto your IOS or Android device. Books can also be read offline on a laptop accessing Sora through <u>soraapp.com</u>.

- 6. Click the button "Sign in using Merici" It will redirect you back to the Merici Login via Microsoft log in with your Merici email

- 8. Books are automatically returned after 21 days


