### A reminder for parents about PE uniform

#### ANU Extension - Information Evening Webinar (Monday 19 September)

FOR CURRENT YEAR 10 STUDENTS WHO WILL BE YEAR 11 STUDENTS IN 2023

ANU Extension is an academic program designed to provide an enhanced learning experience for Year 11 and 12 students. The program is open to all domestic students that will have a concurrent full-time enrolment in Year 11 at an Australian secondary school in 2023. Successful completion of studies in ANU Extension may lead to an early offer for entry to ANU that will allow students to articulate into an ANU Bachelor degree program and receive credit towards this bachelor degree. ANU Extension programs contribute to the Senior Secondary Certificate and toward the ATAR calculation.

It is anticipated that in 2023 advanced courses will be offered in ASTROPHYSICS, CHEMISTRY, BIODIVERSITY, PHYSICS, SPECIALIST MATHEMATICS, DISCOVERING ENGINEERING, CREATIVE COMPUTING, JAPANESE, CHINESE (MANDARIN), INDONESIAN, KOREAN AND COMMERCE.

## LANGUAGES NEWS

#### **Exchange and Host Family Opportunities**

Being an IB school we value the benefits of international mindedness fostered by language acquisition and an education that encourages us to look outwards. School-based in-country experiences have been difficult over the last few years, and we have really missed the opportunity to enrich student learning with overseas travel. However, High School exchange offers a fantastic opportunity for students to discover and learn about the world and another culture, make life-long international friends, challenge themselves and learn more about themselves and what they are capable of. Years 9 or 10 are generally good years for going on exchange.

As a College we would love to see students taking up the opportunity to have in-country experience, not only to support their language acquisition, but also to develop intercultural understanding and resilience. Merici students are encouraged in particular to consider short-term programs that operate during our extended summer holiday period.

One of the student exchange organisations registered in the ACT is World Education Program WEP, a not-for profit student exchange organisation, with a manager based here in the ACT. They are running an online info session on 30 August (see details below), a chance to find out more, including some key deadlines coming ups soon.

Below is a message from Erika, the WEP NSW/ACT Manager:

Greetings from Erika, WEP NSW/ACT Manager!

Is your daughter dreaming about a life-changing experience discovering another culture and way of life? WEP offers ACT students the powerful experience of living 'as locals' in another country through family homestays and local school attendance. Your daughter could become a local in France, Italy, Germany, Argentina, the USA, South Korea, Denmark or one of 13 other countries. Exchange students return home more mature and bring back lifelong friendships and a 'big picture' view of the world in their experience backpack!

Now is a good time to start looking into exchange. If interested in short term programs (Nov-Jan), deadlines for Italy and France are 30 August. These programs are particularly beneficial for Year 10 students as it allows for uninterrupted senior study. For semester and year programs starting in Jan/Feb 2023, deadlines are also fast approaching (30 Jan or 13 Sep, depending on destination). There is a little more time to apply for a July/Aug 2023 semester or year programs (deadlines in March).

Attending an info session is a really important step to work out whether student exchange is for you and whether WEP programs are what you are looking for. You can <u>register here</u> for our upcoming online information sessions on 30 August.

## SUSTAINABILITY NEWS

#### Biodiversity Restoration Project has started!

A Biodiversity Restoration project has commenced at Merici College which will have short-term and long-term stages. Given the decline in Australian wildlife and biodiversity and Australia having the highest rate of species extinction in the world, largely due to land clearing and use of synthetic chemicals, it is important for Merici to make our contribution to the solution. Merici can provide an important travel link and food source for wildlife between Black Mountain and Mount Ainslie.

Advice has been provided from ANU Professor of Biodiversity Conservation to provide understory habitat and nesting boxes. A consultation has been held with the local Landcare group, ACT Sustainable Schools horticulturalist and the Sustainable Schools team. The intention is to create stages for implementation this year and in coming years. The co-curricular Sustainability at Merici (SAM) group will be working on the project.

Planting commenced in Week 4 along the fence line on Henty Street and will continue this year and next to establish food and habitat sources for wildlife. Nesting boxes will be incorporated into the area once food supplies are established.
