Changes to MyWay

MyWay+ is Transport Canberra's next generation ticketing system which puts all public transport services in one place. It will offer more ways to pay for public transport and introduce new digital platforms for journey planning and accessing real-time information.

The switch over to MyWay+ will happen later this year. Until then, students should continue to use their current MyWay card or a paper ticket from a ticket vending machine to pay for travel on bus and light rail services. Families should ensure their child's MyWay card is registered to protect the balance, as Transport Canberra can only process refunds and transfer credits for registered MyWay cards.

Classroom Mastery

Your Daughter's may has come home and talked about some changes to our routines here at Merici. We have now implemented Classroom Mastery in all our classrooms from Year 7-12. Merici is very lucky to be one of ten pilot schools in the archdiocese.

At the heart of Classroom Mastery lies a commitment to fostering a consistently productive, safe and calm atmosphere where every Student can thrive academically and personally.

Classroom Mastery aims to:

- create consistently productive, safe and calm learning spaces
- reduce disruptive and off-task behaviours
- increase engagement in learning



Why?

We know that safe, ordered and positive learning environments are the foundations for learning. Although it is common sense, this is backed up by significant research (PISA 2019). Although we do not have significant and problematic behaviour at Merici, we are committed to improving our practice, so students can learn in the best possible way. Our implementation of this program means establishing and practicing set consistent routines. These are sequences of what to do, when and how. In short, there are clear 'recipes' for how to prepare for learning and how to participate in learning. A behaviour curriculum is like a Mathematics or English curriculum. It means that our students learn the right behaviours so successful learning can happen, where our classrooms are safe, orderly and predictable.

We now have routines for:

Entry routine: Students are to line up in a quiet, orderly and calm manner before entering the classroom. They enter and then stand behind their chair, waiting for the teacher's greeting and instructions.

Exit routine: Students put away personal and class equipment, the chairs are placed under the desk and the classroom restored. The teacher farewells the students and instructs them to leave in a set manner.

Cue to start and stop work: All students will respond to a spoken cue such as "MC on 3". Each class will have agreed cues for starting and stopping their work. These may be verbal cues or gestures.

Teachers have been working on aligning our school values with norms, expected behaviours, routines, rules and maintaining expectations.

Year 9 Urban Challenge Parent Information Meeting (Wednesday 11 September 5.30pm)

On Wednesday 11 September there will be an opportunity to hear Paul Colagiuri talk in detail about the Year 9 Urban Challenge. The meeting will be via Microsoft Teams from the comfort of your own home commencing at 5.30pm. This information session is for parents and carers only and the link will be emailed closer to the date.

The Year 9 Urban Challenge consists of an innovative and adventurous program designed to engage students in the urban landscape of Sydney and its surroundings. Students will operate in small teams of approximately 15, each taking on the responsibility of a specific role within the group.

Teams are required to complete a series of challenges and activities, embarking on an unfolding adventure that takes them through Sydney. Students are given the freedom to make their own decisions. This includes being responsible for navigating their way around, buying and cooking food, solving clues and managing a team budget.

The Year 9 Urban Challenge will take place over three days in Term Four – Wednesday 30 October to Friday 1 November 2024 and is a compulsory activity. Fees for the camp will appear in Term 4 fee statements.

All meals and snacks are supplied during the trip including a variety of options and team meal challenges that cater for any dietary needs. Students will travel by coach to Sydney where on arrival they will be issued with an Opal Card enabling them access to public transport – ferry, bus, train and light rail for the duration of the trip. Accommodation will be provided in YHA youth hostels and other city group accommodation with room sizes varying from 4 to 6 occupants. Students will be required to carry all their own equipment for the duration of the camp and their accommodation will be in a different location on each of the two evenings.
