ACT Pupil Free Days Term 3

The College will be subject to Registration and a School Improvement Review this year. The purpose of this is to monitor compliance with ACT and Commonwealth Education Acts and CECG requirements to ensure schools meet agreed standards, as well as the provision of support from Catholic Education for our school's continuing performance improvement journey.

The dates for Registration are Tuesday 26 July to Thursday 28 July with a panel of eight representatives from Catholic Education visiting the College. There will be mix of presentations, interviews and classroom observations scheduled across these days.

Approaches to Learning (ATLs) in Maths



MYP unit: Money, products and data

Skill cluster: Social skills

Specific Skill: Negotiate effectively.

For Year 8 in Semester 2, we have decided to focus on "negotiating effectively" as this relates to the real-world context of money and global trade – two areas of direct interest during this Unit. Furthermore, "negotiating" is going to be a skill used and reflected upon in one of their assessment items during the Semester. Students began developing their negotiating skills by using the L.I.S.T.E.N tool. This acronym is a list of tips for students to keep in mind when they are struggling to work with others.

- <u>L</u>ook and <u>L</u>isten (make eye contact, watch for body language)
- Inquire and find Information (ask questions about what the other person said)
- <u>S</u>ummarise (what did someone else say?)
- <u>T</u>ake a breath (when you speak, don't talk too much)
- <u>Encourage</u> and show <u>Empathy</u> (think about someone else's feelings)
- <u>N</u>eutralise your feelings (be open to new opinions and ideas)

Students begun with some games focused on developing specific negotiating skills in interpreting body language and showing empathy in interpreting the feelings of other.


CREATIVE AND PERFORMING ARTS

The Burial at Thebes: A version of Sophocles' Antigone (Friday 5 August, Saturday 6 August)

Merici College proudly presents *The Burial at Thebes: A version of Sophocles' Antigone* which is a play by Irish Nobel laureate Seamus Heaney, based on the fifth century BC tragedy Antigone by Sophocles.

The play tells how Antigone, the daughter of Oedipus, gives her brother, the traitor Polyneices, a form of ritual burial (she scatters his corpse with dust) against the explicit instructions of her uncle, King Creon, and the advice of her sister, Ismene, even though she knows that the consequence will be her death.

DonateLife Week (DLW) 2022 starts this Sunday (Sunday 24 July – Sunday 3 July). We are excited to share what is planned to raise awareness of organ and tissue donation in the ACT for <u>The Great Registration Race</u>, the official DLW



theme. Join us in the ACT as we race to encourage 100,000 more Australians to register on the Australian Organ Donor Register (AODR).

We know 4 in 5 Australians support donation, yet there are around 13 million Australians aged 16+ who are eligible to register as an organ and tissue donor – but haven't yet.

For around 1,750 Australians currently on the organ transplant waitlist, it can be a matter of life and death. There are also an additional 13,000 people on dialysis who may benefit from a kidney transplant. For others, an eye or other tissue transplant is a path to a greatly improved quality of life. That's why, this year, our message is 'don't delay, join the Great Registration Race today'.
