#### **COVID Smart Measures**

NSW and ACT Health recently advised that they are starting to see a rise in COVID-19 transmissions within the community, with a peak of cases expected in early December. COVID-smart measures continue to be in place and are vital in allowing us to keep our schools operational while prioritising student and staff wellbeing. These measures include:

- staying home if unwell and/or showing any symptoms
- mask-wearing strongly encouraged, particularly when indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible, and on public transport
- continued mandatory mask-wearing for anyone working with students at greater risk of serious illness whether they are in specialist centres, support unit or mainstream classroom
- using rapid antigen tests (RATs) when showing symptoms or exposed to COVID-19
- encouraging all students, staff, and families to keep up to date with their vaccinations, including COVID-19 booster shots if eligible.

#### Resignations at the end of 2022

Lee Hennequin: Lee leaves Merici after 22 years. She will be retiring at the end of this year, having started employment in January 2000 in the role of Student Administrative Officer/Computer Administrator. Over the years of her employment, Lee's areas of responsibilities were varied, from providing assistance primarily to the Deputy Principal (Teaching and Learning) to meet the assessment and reporting requirements of the College, to assisting teachers to use the SEQTA Reporting Program.



Lee also provided College Timetable support, software management to collect student subject choices and assisted in the administration of the major semester exams and Parent/Teacher interviews administrative support.

Gillian Dingley: Gillian has been an extremely well-known staff member amongst students and families. Gillian will be retiring at the end of 2022. She commenced employment here in Term 2, 2009 in the role of Student Services and Attendance Officer. Gillian has efficiently and effectively managed the Student Services Office. This has included general day-to-day support to teaching staff, assistance to the student cohort, administrative support for attendance, first aid, excursions, immunisations, lost property. The list goes on and on...

**Brooke Wood:** Brooke has recently announced that she will be moving from Merici after 14 years. Brooke has taught Health and Physical Education, Sport and Recreation, Sports Science and Religious Education. She was also involved in the establishment of the Fitness Club back in 2010 and was a House Coordinator in 2011, 2012 and 2013. Brooke is looking forward to exploring opportunities that sit outside of teaching to continue with her personal growth and development across a broad range of areas. She is currently working as a HR consultant in the AFP.

Phil Coe: Phil leave Merici after 12 years of exceptional service. Phil began at Merici in October 2010, initially teaching Media & Maths having returned from teaching in central London for 4 years. In 2015, he was successful in gaining the position of Head of Senior School, responsible for the academic care of all students in Years 10, 11 and 12 a role that he transformed and made his own. In 2017 he was appointed as Deputy Principal, responsible for Pastoral Care & Staffing, undertaking this role until 2022 when his focus become more closely related to administration and compliance.

Phil has taught a range of subjects over the years include Mathematics (Senior & Junior), Senior Business Studies, Information Technology, Media and Economics & Business. There was nothing that Phil couldn't teach (maybe not Music).

Over the last 5 years, staff have been amazed at his ability to use data for the improvement of teacher's knowledge of our students. Phil's legendary student data sheets presented at the beginning of each year have continued to amaze teachers. It is with sincere regret that we farewell Mr. Phil Coe who has accepted a position at St. Clare's College in 2023.

Giles Thompson: Giles came to Merici right after finishing his Graduate Diploma. He was working as a tutor and a lab tech and an GIS engineering firm. He commenced work at Merici in 2013. Giles has taught Senior Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and IT, Junior Science, IT/Digital Technology, Engineering, Maths. He has also assisted in the Duke of Ed program and Gaming Group. Giles will be working as a data science and trainer in the Federal public service.

Trish Young: Trish commenced employment at Merici in January 2020. She taught Hospitality, Food Technology and Photography. Trish also coached Merici AFL teams for at least 6 years and travelled to Darwin, Sydney and Melbourne with the ACT School girls' team.
