Year 10-12 Exams BSSS

All students have been emailed individual exam timetables so that they are aware of what exams they have and when they are scheduled. Exams will take place in the Auditorium. Students with special considerations have been emailed about the location of their exams.

Students in Years 11 and 12 are only required to be at school when they have exams. Students should remain at home outside of their exams. Students are not required to wear school uniforms for their exams, comfortable clothing is recommended.

Importantly, if your daughter is unwell on the day of a scheduled exam, she must send an email to Mrs Spiller (stephanie.spiller@merici.act.edu.au) and obtain a medical certificate to cover the absence. Medical Certificates from pharmacies are accepted as it can be challenging to get into a GP at short notice.

iC NEWS

Students growing up in the technical age have a strong reliance on the free web, "to Google". This often leads to use of poor-quality sources. Some students have struggled in their organisation, not leaving themselves enough time to research, note take and draft, good assignments take time.

We are continuously working with classes, on the skills of note taking, paraphrasing, academic integrity, and the use of quality resources. Plagiarism can take many forms, and we want students to research widely and well, use their own words, to quote when necessary, and use evidence that supports their own ideas and writing.







One of the best things you can do as parents is to talk to your daughters about their research and tasks. This helps to solidify their ideas and ensures they understand their reading, enabling them to put the information into their own words, to paraphrase. As a school we use Turnitin as a similarity tool. Students are able to submit a draft before the submission date to check the assignment similarity, it will pick up if the writing is too similar to another source this then gives the student an opportunity to redraft the task before it is too late.

Using quality resources is a must for high school and college research, the iC provides many quality databases for all students to access through SEQTA.

Year 9 Ascent Training Services – Youth Drive Program

Merici College is proud to offer an opportunity to Year 9 students which will be run by Ascent Training services. This half day program will include a safety workshop, vehicle demonstration and a supervised drive of a dual-control vehicle on a purpose-built track.

The program will include:

Road safety workshop involving discussion about sharing the road, passing distances for cyclists, fun
interactive activities about braking times, the effects of alcohol on driving ability and a road rules quiz.

- Vehicle demonstration describing the components of a vehicle, including safety features, general maintenance and tire changing.
- Supervised drive in a dual-control vehicle in a controlled environment to give the students their first experience of driving a vehicle and what is required to do it safely.

This program will take place at Thoroughbred Park, Lyneham.

The course will be run on three occasions:

- 22 November 8:45am-1:00pm (FULL)
- 25 November 8:45am-1:00pm
- 27 November 8:45am-1:00pm

Parents wishing their daughter to participate in this program will be required to choose the day for their daughter, as reflected on the Compass consent forms.

Students will be required to be in PE uniform and bring a packed lunch on their day. Students will be transported by Merici bus to and from the venue. Please note this day is **optional** and students not attending will continue with their regular classes.

The cost per student will be \$282 for one session and payment is due prior to 1st November.
