Enrolment Process

Please note that Mrs Masters has commenced enrolment interviews for 2026. If you are interested in submitting an enrolment application, please follow the link https://www.merici.act.edu.au/enrolment. Please ensure that all supporting documentation is uploaded as required. Documentation includes:

- Birth certificate (not commemorative) or passport.
- Certificate of Baptism (if applicable).
- Last report from previous school (This documentation is required for all applications at Merici College.)
- Family Law, Personal Protection Order or Other Relevant Court Orders (if applicable)
- Visa grant notice for permanent and temporary visa-holders (if applicable) for both student and parent(s) / legal guardian(s)
- Australian Citizenship Certificate (if applicable) for parent(s)/legal guardian(s)
- Any medical reports and/or other assessment reports for students with additional learning needs (if applicable).

If your daughter is currently attending Year 6 at one of our Catholic Education (CE) primary schools, please ensure that the information entered on the College enrolment application is the same as the information you

have previously provided when enrolling your daughter at their primary school. (For example, residential address, email, telephone number).

Year 11 2026 - Senior College at Merici

Year 10 parents and students, please note that it is **not** necessary to re-enrol your daughter Year 11 at Merici. Your daughter's enrolment will automatically continue.

Carparking

With the growth of student numbers at Merici College the imperative for safe driving around the college is greater than ever.

Teaching Staff wearing hi-viz vests act as traffic wardens in and around drop-off zones for students. They help keep traffic moving but more importantly they help keep students safe around moving cars.

1. Please refrain from dropping students off in non-designated drop off zones, especially around buses – the presence of which when held up by cars causes

- 2. Please DO NOT drop off students at carparks on Limestone Avenue. Entering and exiting carparks on Limestone Avenue is restricted to a single-lane driveway, so to drop off students is dangerous especially during peak hour as cars must stand and wait on Limestone Avenue. There have been several nearmisses reported as there are no traffic wardens there to help keep students safe.
- 3. Only use drop off zone at the Wise Street carpark.

WHOLE SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

2. What do you have to do?

Tokens can be purchased in the following ways:

- a. Online via Trybooking at https://www.trybooking.com/DBNVH
- b. Pre-purchase at recess and lunch times a week before the event or purchase on the day. Students will only be able to pay for these tokens using cash or EFTPOS, not their student cards. All pre-purchased tokens will be distributed to students during PC on the morning of St Angela Merici Day itself.

Further points to note:

- All token purchases should be viewed as a donation to the House charities. There will be no refunds for unused tokens;
- At the end of the activities, students can write their name on any unused tokens and we will conduct a raffle the following week for some great prizes.

Seasons for Growth - Learning to live with change and loss. Expressions of Interest, Term 3.



We are inviting Expressions of Interest from parents/carers of students in **Years 7–8** to participate in our *Seasons for Growth* program, running in Term 3.

Seasons for Growth is a small group program that aims to support young people who have experienced significant change or loss - such as family separation, death, or other major life transitions. The program helps participants understand and manage the impacts of change, build resilience, and strengthen their emotional wellbeing in a safe and supportive environment.

The program uses a wide range of age-appropriate activities to explore feelings, develop coping strategies, and foster connection with others who may have had similar experiences. It is important to note that this program is an educational program and not a counselling/therapeutic small group program.

Push Up Challenge

This year, Merici is once again participating in the Push Up Challenge! Our names are Jess and Aurelia, and we are your student ambassadors this year. Registrations are open and we're back again to promote mental health at Merici and have fun while doing it! We're getting involved from 4-26 June 2025 and would love for you to join US.

The Challenge is to complete 3,214 push-ups (or 1,607 if you choose the half target) in 24 days to raise awareness and funds for mental health. This represents the 3,214 people who died by suicide in Australia in 2023 (the most recent stats), which is why we want to push for better, and hope you will too.

Sound like too many push-ups? No worries, you can do the half target and substitute push-ups for alternative exercises, like squats and sit-ups.

It's free to take part and there's a great app where you get daily targets and mental health facts, track your progress, and can check out our collective stats.

We have created a community, which is grouped into all of the PC's, and by joining our community as a member of your PC, we'll be able to track our collective stats, as well as see our own personal leader board for PC's and individuals.


Students should have submitted **Criterion A: Planning Report Draft** and arranged a meeting with their supervisor to discuss their draft and get some feedback.

iC NEWS

There was an article last month in *The Guardian* titled 'Most parents don't enjoy reading to their children', - this was in response to a survey conducted by Nielsen and Harper Collins. As educators and parents, this was a worrying article. Our role is to promote both literacy and the importance of reading. Yet many parents feel that reading and literacy is just a skill, not something that we should encourage children to love. A follow up <u>article published</u> last week stated that "children become fluent readers by being drawn into the enjoyment of books".



If adults are not promoting reading, modelling reading for pleasure and discussing the books we are reading with our young and older children, we are all missing out on this important learning opportunity. We have all seen the articles on the 'benefits of reading'. They highlight the importance to our health and wellbeing, both from a personal perspective and for academic success. Throughout the year junior students are provided with a lesson a fortnight to read for pleasure in their Integrated Humanities or English classes.

During these Wide Reading lessons, we talk about the benefits of reading for pleasure. Those students who chose to pick up and read a book for the love of it are more likely to make significant progress in vocabulary, spelling, and maths than those who read very little (Sullivan and Brown, 2013; Merga, 2021). Reading for pleasure can increase empathy, improve relationships with others, reduce depression and stress and improve wellbeing throughout life (The Reading

Agency, 2015). At school we provide many opportunities to celebrate books and be involved as readers, such as participating in the Kids' Lit Quiz, Book Club and various Book Week activities (Term 3). This week, we start reading the picture books from the short-listed CBCA titles during Wide Reading. How are you supporting your child's recreational reading at home?

- Wednesday Week B Chess Club in the Small Group Room
- Thursday Cosy Café and Digital Detox (read a book, crochet or play a game with hot chocolate in the Reading Area).
