#### Important information - Future of Education Equity Fund

Please see below important information from the ACT Government regarding increased support for families through the Future of Education Equity Fund.

As part of the 2025–26 ACT Budget, the ACT Government has announced a \$600,000 boost to the Equity Fund. This will enable an additional 1,000 eligible ACT students to receive financial assistance in the 2025 school year.

The Equity Fund is available to families of students enrolled in preschool to Year 12 in any ACT school—government or non-government—who are experiencing financial disadvantage. Support provided through the Fund assists with education-related expenses and aims to ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to fully participate in their learning.

Funding amounts for 2025 are as follows:

- \$400 for preschool students
- \$500 for primary school students
- \$750 for high school and college students

In 2024 alone, the Fund has supported over 5,000 students across the ACT, distributing more than \$3 million to families in need.

#### Price Increase – Uniform Shop

Please note that there will be a general price increase for garments sold in the College uniform shop. On average, prices will increase by approximately 6% and will take effect beginning of Term 4 later this year. This increase is necessary to cover increases in operational costs and is being kept to an absolute minimum. Prices have only risen once before since we commenced trading with our own uniform shop in 2019.

The uniform shop will move to new larger premises in 2026 as part of the planned refurbishment of the Scout Hall on Limestone Avenue known as the O'Donnell Youth Centre.

## DonatelLife ACT Week Launch (Monday 28 July)

<u>DonateLife ACT</u> will hold their DonateLife Week launch event at Merici College on Monday, 28 July 2025.

This year commemorates 50 years of organ and tissue donation in the nation's capital.

At the age of 11, Annette Taylor, became the ACT's first organ donor. Annette was a much-loved student of Merici College at the time of her passing and is fondly remembered for her strength and determination – always a sister to us all.

Set in the forecourt of the grounds of the College and surrounding the lightbox in Annette's honour, it is symbolic that we as a community join together with DonateLife ACT and pay homage to Annette and the Taylor family this DonateLife Week.

Anyone in Australia aged 16 and over can register on the <u>Australian Organ Donor Register</u>. It only takes one minute.

#### Expression of Interest – 2026 Cambodia Immersion (2026 Years 10–12)

Merici College has received initial approval to proceed with planning the 2026 Cambodia Immersion, scheduled for 11–24 July 2026. This co-curricular opportunity is open to students in **Years 10–12** in 2026 and will be offered in partnership with Ripple Effect Rides, a provider with significant experience in ethical, community-based travel.

The immersion experience will focus on:

- o Cultural exchange and language
- o Community development projects affiliated with <u>REACH Siem Reap</u>
- o Environmental sustainability
- o Ethical reflection and global citizenship
- o A visit to our affiliated primary school

We anticipate this being a transformative and enriching experience for all involved. The full itinerary and programme overview are outlined in the attached proposal provided by <u>Ripple Effect Rides</u>.

# Years 9 – 11 Students: Expression of Interest: Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF) – Melbourne 2025

The Catholic Education Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn (CECG) is seeking expressions of interest from students who would like to participate in the upcoming Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF), which will be held in Melbourne from Sunday 30 November to Tuesday 2 December.

This national gathering of Catholic young people is a vibrant and formative event. It will bring together youth aged 16 to 18 and post-school leavers up to age 25 for a celebration of faith, community, and encounter. The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne is hosting it at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre (MCEC). Archbishop Christopher Prowse, Chair of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) Commission for Evangelisation, is strongly encouraging school participation in this important event. CECG hopes that each school will be represented by a small group of students accompanied by staff members.

The approximate cost per student is \$1800, which includes transport, accommodation, and registration for the three-day festival. While some funding support may be available through Catholic Education, this will depend on the final numbers of participants and staff and will be communicated once expressions of interest have been received.


