IMPORTANT NEWS

Important information - Future of Education Equity Fund

Please see below important information from the ACT Government regarding increased support for families through the Future of Education Equity Fund.

As part of the 2025–26 ACT Budget, the ACT Government has announced a \$600,000 boost to the Equity Fund. This will enable an additional 1,000 eligible ACT students to receive financial assistance in the 2025 school year.

The Equity Fund is available to families of students enrolled in preschool to Year 12 in any ACT school—government or non-government—who are experiencing financial disadvantage. Support provided through the Fund assists with education-related expenses and aims to ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to fully participate in their learning.

Funding amounts for 2025 are as follows:

- \$400 for preschool students
- \$500 for primary school students
- \$750 for high school and college students

In 2024 alone, the Fund has supported over 5,000 students across the ACT, distributing more than \$3 million to families in need.

Price Increase – Uniform Shop

Please note that there will be a general price increase for garments sold in the College uniform shop. On average, prices will increase by approximately 6% and will take effect beginning of Term 4 later this year. This increase is necessary to cover increases in operational costs and is being kept to an absolute minimum. Prices have only risen once before since we commenced trading with our own uniform shop in 2019.

The uniform shop will move to new larger premises in 2026 as part of the planned refurbishment of the Scout Hall on Limestone Avenue known as the O'Donnell Youth Centre.

Academic Awards Semester 1 (Monday 11 August)

The Academic Awards Ceremony will take place on Monday 11 August, 10:00am – 10.40am (Session 1), 11:00am-12:00pm (Session 2). This event will also be livestreamed via https://merici.college/go/livestream.

Please note that students receiving awards or scholarships will be notified through Pastoral Care groups and correspondence will be emailed home to parents. We are unable to indicate the award your daughter is receiving until the time of the ceremony.

Car parking for the event is available in the car park next to the oval and the student car park off Henty Street. Parents need to follow parking signage on Wise Street, Henty Street and Helemon Street. Parents are urged NOT to park on nature strips, school crossing zones or in a dangerous position (i.e. too close to intersections) as parking inspectors may be out and about and parking infringements will be issued for any vehicle that does not comply with the above. Parking may be difficult for the second ceremony at 11:00am, as parents attending the first session will still be at school on your arrival.

Visitors will be directed to enter the Auditorium via the two doors accessible from Wise Street and be seated for the commencement of the ceremony.

YEARS 10, 11 and 12 NEWS

When your Year 11/Year 12 student comes home and says class is cancelled.

For parents who are hearing this from their child when arriving home in the middle of the day saying their classes have been cancelled.

At Merici College we don't 'cancel' classes. We do notify students when we do not have enough relief to cover classes whose teachers are away on camps, excursions, PL or absent due to illness or carer's leave. By Year 11 we expect that students have the capacity to complete the work that has been left for them on SEQTA. As BSSS students have 55 hours of coursework to complete for each unit (IB students even more), it is imperative that students complete the work set for them by their absent teachers. (Please note here that staff are always expected to leave content on SEQTA).

As senior students they are allowed to sign out, but this is not something we actively encourage. Students are welcome to complete work in the library, or in specially allocated Senior Study space – both areas are actively supervised.

If students stay at school and work, they will meet their content hours and can seek assistance from staff or each other if required. Driving home or going out with friends means that time is lost which should be spent completing course work. An uncovered class isn't cancelled; it means that students need to independently complete the work set on SEQTA.

Years 9 – 11 Students: Expression of Interest: Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF) – Melbourne 2025

The Catholic Education Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn (CECG) is seeking expressions of interest from students who would like to participate in the upcoming Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF), which will be held in Melbourne from Sunday 30 November to Tuesday 2 December.

This national gathering of Catholic young people is a vibrant and formative event. It will bring together youth aged 16 to 18 and post-school leavers up to age 25 for a celebration of faith, community, and encounter. The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne is hosting it at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre (MCEC). Archbishop Christopher Prowse, Chair of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) Commission for Evangelisation, is strongly encouraging school participation in this important event. CECG hopes that each school will be represented by a small group of students accompanied by staff members.

The approximate cost per student is \$1800, which includes transport, accommodation, and registration for the three-day festival. While some funding support may be available through Catholic Education, this will depend on the final numbers of participants and staff and will be communicated once expressions of interest have been received.

On the opening of the 48th Parliament of Australia, we attended Question Time in the House of Representatives. It was a significant occasion because, for the first time in Federal parliamentary history, more than 50% of parliamentarians in the House are women. The Hon. Catherine King, speaking on behalf of the Minister for Women, stated "...there are now more women in parliament and cabinet making decisions for women." The Minister reiterated this when she said "...having women in the room matters." Throughout our studies in Global Politics, we have learnt about the secondary role women often play in relation to government policy, provision of services and peacemaking. Conversely, women are often at the forefront as victims of sexual violence, conflict and poor wellbeing outcomes.
